On average, those with a master's degree earn 21% higher income than those with a bachelor's degree.¹ And in today's workforce, several entry-level positions now require a master's degree to be considered.²

Those with a master's degree earn, on average, \$1,737 in weekly median earnings compared to \$1,493 for those with only a bachelor's degree.³
